

This is the heart of our faith in the Communion of Saints — the unbreakable bond between the Church on earth, the souls in purgatory, and the saints in heaven. St. Ambrose once reminded us, "We have loved them during life; let us not abandon them until we have conducted them by our prayers into the house of the Lord." These words capture the spirit of November — love expressed not in grief alone, but in hope and fidelity. So, as we light candles, write names in our Books of Remembrance, and whisper prayers for those we miss, let us do so with peaceful hearts. For in God's mercy, no act of love is forgotten, and no soul is ever lost. May our remembrance this month be filled with gratitude, trust, and a renewed longing for the eternal home where, one day, we shall all be united in the joy of God's kingdom.
