"That They May All Be One" – The Vision of Unity in Today's Church: In a world often marked by division, polarization, and personal agendas, the words of Jesus echo with deep urgency: "I pray... that they may all be one, just as You, Father, are in Me and I in You." (John 17:21) Jesus did not found the Church to be a loose collection of individual opinions or isolated groups. He established it as a living Body—one in faith, one in mission, and one in love. His vision was never about power, control, or popularity. It was always about communion—a unity that mirrors the perfect love between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Why Unity Matters Today: Today, more than ever, the Church is called to witness something radically different from the world. Where the world builds walls, Jesus calls us to build bridges. Where society divides people into "us" and "them," the Church must become a home for all who seek truth, healing, and peace. This unity is not about everyone being the same. It is about diverse people, with different gifts and experiences, working together for the common good—united by a shared faith and a shared love for Christ.

Signs of Real Unity in a Parish:

Respect and charity: Speaking with love, even in disagreement.

Cooperation, not competition: Supporting each ministry and person's role.

Listening hearts: Seeking to understand before trying to be understood.

Forgiveness and humility: Letting go of pride to build peace.

Shared purpose: Remembering that we all belong to God's mission, not our own.

Unity is not just a theological ideal—it is a lived reality that the world is desperate to see. People today are searching not only for answers, but for authentic communities. If we, the Church, cannot model unity, how can we proclaim the Gospel of peace?

A Call to Renewed Unity:

Let us remember: The Church is not a business, a club, or a battlefield—it is a family rooted in Christ. Every action, every word, every attitude we bring to our parish life either builds that unity or breaks it down.

This week, reflect on Jesus' prayer. Ask yourself:

Am I helping to build unity, or creating division?

Do my words and actions reflect the love of Christ?

Am I willing to see the Church not as mine or theirs, but ours, united in Him?

In the end, unity is not optional. It is the heart of Christ's mission—so that the world may believe. Let's choose unity. Let's live it, protect it, and pray for it every day.
