Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 18–25 January 2026: Each year, from 18th to 25th January, Christians throughout the world observe the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. During this time, we are invited to pray together and to renew our commitment to the unity that Jesus prayed for when he said, "That they may all be one" (John 17:21). These dates are significant in the life of the Church, linking the Feast of the Chair of St Peter with the Conversion of St Paul. They remind us that unity is both a gift from God and a call to ongoing conversion of heart. Christian unity does not mean uniformity, but a willingness to walk together in faith, humility, and love. Our divisions weaken our witness to the Gospel, while unity strengthens it and becomes a powerful sign of hope in a divided world. During this week, we are encouraged to pray for one another, to speak with charity about other Christian traditions, and to seek ways to grow in understanding and cooperation. Unity begins in prayer and is nurtured by love, respect, and service. In a world marked by division, conflict, and isolation, Christian unity is a powerful sign of hope. When Christians strive for unity, they proclaim that reconciliation is possible, that love is stronger than division, and that Christ is alive among us. Jesus himself tells us that unity among his followers will be a sign to the world: "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:35) This Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, let us unite in prayer and advocacy for the people of Armenia and Artsakh, calling for an end to violence and the restoration of peace. How can we live this week in the parish? During the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, parishioners are encouraged to: Pray daily for unity among Christians, Include intentions for unity in personal and family prayer, Speak with respect and charity about other Christian traditions, Seek opportunities for dialogue, cooperation, and shared service, Examine our own hearts and attitudes toward those who are different from us, Even small acts—kind words, openness, prayerful silence—can contribute to the healing of divisions.
