**The Season of Creation** begins next Tuesday, 1<sup>st</sup> September, and runs until Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> October, uniting Christians across the world in prayer and action to care for our common home. This year's theme, "Living Water", invites us to reflect on God's life-giving presence in creation and our responsibility to protect and nurture the gift of the natural world.

**Missio:** All are welcome to join Missio and the Mill Hill Missionaries, on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> September, for a special Mass to celebrate 90 years of the Red Box: that has helped in gathering prayers and spare coins in Catholic homes across England and Wales to support vulnerable global communities. Bishop Patrick will celebrate Mass at 12 noon in Saint Teresa's Church, Aspley (NG8 3EP), and refreshments will be available in the parish hall after Mass.

**Mission Together, 12<sup>th</sup> September 2026:** Join the 'Workshop for everyone' at Holy Cross Priory in Leicester. Pope Leo and Pope Francis ask all the baptised to build new relationships in the church through 'synodality' (walking together). Led by Dr Austen Ivereigh, Pope Francis' biographer and an invited expert at the synod on synodality, the workshop runs 10am - 3pm and will explore practical ways to listen and connect for mission. **From Holiday Rest to a New Beginning:** As our summer holidays come to an end and we return home to our familiar routines, perhaps we should ask ourselves: What has changed in me? A holiday is not only about travelling to new places, enjoying good food, meeting family and friends, taking photographs and, of course, wondering why the suitcase seems to become heavier on the journey home! It can also be a precious opportunity to rest, reflect and rediscover God's presence in our lives. The Church reminds us that genuine rest should renew not only our bodies but also our hearts and spirits. Perhaps during these summer days we have seen something beautiful in creation, enjoyed the gift of family, experienced kindness from a stranger, visited a church or shrine, or simply had a quiet moment when we felt close to God. Now, as we come home, let us not leave those moments behind like forgotten holiday photographs. Let us bring something of that peace, gratitude and joy into our ordinary lives. St Augustine reminds us that our hearts are restless until they rest in God. Perhaps the greatest souvenir we can bring home is therefore not something we bought, but a renewed heart. Let us return with new intentions: to pray a little more faithfully, to make time for Sunday Mass, to forgive someone we have been carrying in our hearts, to speak more kindly, to spend more time with those we love, to notice someone who is lonely, and to become more generous with our time and gifts. Our holiday may be finished, but God's invitation continues. We are not simply returning to the old routine; we are being invited to begin again with God. As we step into the coming weeks, may we place our plans, hopes, worries and responsibilities into the Lord's hands and say: "Lord, I have rested; now help me to return refreshed, renewed and ready to serve You and one another." May our homes, our families and our parish become places where the joy we experienced during the summer continues to grow, and may we discover that the real journey was never simply going away and coming back home, but coming closer to God. As one Catholic reflection beautifully puts it, summer can become a time to "rest, return, renewed." Let us therefore return home with thankful hearts, renewed faith and a new plan—not simply asking, "What shall I do next?" but, "Lord, what are You calling me to do next?"
