**Just a quick and friendly heads-up for everyone.** As you may know, the Lloyds Bank branch in Alfreton will be closing on 19<sup>th</sup> January 2026. However, Lloyds have recently informed us that from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2026, cheques will no longer be accepted at the Post Office and can only be paid in at a Lloyds branch, such as Sutton or Chesterfield. Thankfully, we don't receive many cheques, but to avoid extra travel, work, and confusion, we kindly ask hall hirers and donors, where possible, to pay directly into the parish account.
