George Jones' posthumous 100th Birthday Wednesday 28 December 2022: On the Wednesday after Christmas it is the posthumous 100th birthday of our much loved and respected, deceased parishioner, George Jones. George worshipped at Christ the King for decades, and in retirement was one of the most loved and respected alter servers and a tremendous support to our parish priests. George was 21 when he landed on the Normandy Beaches on D-Day, and fought all the way to Germany where he took part in the liberation of the concentration camps and saw the end of World War 2. George fell in love with and married a local girl, before returning home to England with their young family. George never lost his humanity, his trust in God or his Welsh accent. George died on 30 May 2012. Come and join us on Wednesday 28th December to celebrate posthumously his 100th birthday. May he forever rest in peace with his Queen, Elizabeth II and her father King George VI.
