Advent Reflection - "Make Room for the Lord": Advent is the season that reminds us: Christ is coming, but He also comes today." Advent is a gentle but powerful season, a sacred time when God invites us to slow down, breathe, and prepare our hearts for the coming of Jesus. The world around us may rush toward Christmas with noise, bright lights, and endless lists of things to do, but Advent calls us to something deeper. It is a season of waiting—not a passive waiting, but a hopeful, joyful, expectant waiting. Just as Mary prepared her heart and life to welcome the Christ Child, we too are invited to make room for Jesus in the quiet places of our lives. Advent reminds us that God often enters our world softly. He comes not in thunder or grandeur, but in the simplicity of a manger, in the ordinary moments of our day, and in the silent corners of our hearts. This season calls us to light a candle in the darkness—an act of faith that says: "Lord, even in the challenges of life, I believe You are coming." Every candle we light on the Advent wreath pushes back the darkness a little more, reminding us that God's love always brings hope, healing, and new beginnings. But Advent is also a time of preparation. Not just preparing our homes, but preparing our hearts. It is an invitation to reconciliation, forgiveness, and renewed faith. It is a season to remember that Jesus comes not only at Christmas, not only at the end of time, but every single day—whenever we choose love over anger, generosity over selfishness, and mercy over judgment. Advent is our opportunity to ask: What needs healing in my life? What needs letting go? Where do I need Christ's light? So let this Advent be different. Let it be a time when we intentionally pause, pray, and listen. A time to rediscover the joy of the Gospel, the quiet peace of God's presence, and the simple truth that we are deeply loved. Remember: Every candle we light is a reminder that God's light grows even in small steps. Every prayer we whisper becomes an open door for Christ to enter. Every act of kindness makes the world a little more like Bethlehem on that holy night. As we prepare the crib in our churches and homes, let us also prepare a place in our hearts—clean, ready, and joyful—for the One who comes to save us. May this holy season awaken in us a new hope, a deeper faith, and a renewed desire to welcome Christ into our hearts, our homes, and our parish community. Come, Lord Jesus—do not delay.
